'Who would do that'....LGB Pullman refit

Way back in October 2024 I made a purchase of 2 x LGB Pullman coaches in Red/Cream livery from a well know auction site (starts with the letter 'E'). As most of you know by now I love anything LGB RHB/Swiss, so the purchase seemed to be a no brainer as they say. The only catch was the previous owner kindly glued Walt Disney characters all over both roofs..... Who does that! The price was good because of said figures ,so I took a chance.

On receiving the coaches I found that not only did they have the figures glued well and truly to the roof, but Kadee couplers had been fitted instead of LGB couplers, but to do this the previous owner had cut off all the Buffers! On top of this ,the coaches were fitted with some un branded metal wheels with friction electrical pick ups for the internal lights.

I had hoped that the Disney figures had been put in place using blue tack, but no, they had used something similar to Araldite bonding glue. It took a large pair of pliers and all my effort to get the figures off. The result was that big areas of hard dried glue had been left behind. At first I did try to use a de bonding agent to loosen the glue, which did work but left craters in the roof were it had eaten into the plastic. In the end I used a small electric modelling grinder to remove the glue, at least that way I could limit the amount of plastic that was removed. After all the old glue was removed I then had to use car body filler to fill the rough areas, followed by lots of sanding.

After all the sanding down was completed, several coats of Grey primer was used with wet and dry sand paper between coats. Finally several top coats of silver to match the original finish.

Once the painting had been completed I had to cut away the old wiring from the bogies and where necessary extend the wires so they could be fitted to new Ball Bearing wheels fitted with electrical pick ups.

Finally I had to drill, re mould, to fit new buffers, and fit LGB couplers to complete the so called re fit. The pictures best describe most of the work:


Webmasters Report
