At long last this little loco, finished earlier this year is fully working. Within the tiny bonnet are 4xAAA batteries, a small low voltage ESC from eBay, a switch, a red con twin aerial receiver and way, way to much wiring (something to be reviewed now it is all working). The magnets holding the bonnet cover on are straining somewhat..... but this tiny thing is now radio controlled! The batteries must be 6v all the testing with rechargeable ones & LiPo has failed. The large silver switch on the chassis for manual control can now be removed and the angled tension arm fitted instead.

The loco being 3D printed is very light with no space at all for weights. Despite being twin axle drive can manage about as much as the real thing i.e. 6 or so light tippers, 1 bogie wagon (WD D class) or 2-3 hoppers. But being twin drive means it WILL climb the spiral so that's good news too. Happy harry the driver is customarily happy about the English climate and the open cab......





Bole Laser kit Hunslet out on the line first time!!! The roundhouse chassis runs very smoothly and should pull a reasonable amount, time will tell. The lightweight body does not exactly match up to steel and brass roundhouse ones in weight terms. So far we have only tried a bit of track clearing and the long but low roofed van shown here.

It looks just the stocky general purpose loco I was after. It is finished in a military green so should be OK for dual use.

The brass headlight was got for another project but is so much better than the plastic one supplied I could not resist fitting it.

After a short spell in the workshop for minor repairs, Criccieth Castle takes the service today. First up the brush wagon now fitted with some new brushes to replace the worn out ones. Then the paraffin dribbler to clear the sandy grit from the rain head followed by the brake / mess van. All worked well with the gravel being adequately distributed, although at times a large broom was deployed.

For the record after a charge with the smart delta peak charger, today overall she ran for 2 hours. Probably good for plenty more time but the weather closed in and the team retired to the pub.

Other men go playing golf in sunshine or in rain Not for us that blessed peace he stays at home to run his train


To him the weekly shopping trip is a cruel imposition Wasting time far better spent at a railway exhibition

Webmasters Report


